Rick said the sales price remain the same, \$2.00 for kids, \$3.00 for seniors and \$5.00 general admission. The team is maintained by the sale of beer, soft drinks, tri-tip sandwiches and hot dogs. The games start at 7:15 on a regular basis. A nice feature for group functions is the Party Pavilion. For \$500.00 a group can reserve the picnic area down the left field line for the day. This is great for birthday parties, group gatherings and company events. This comes with 50 admission tickets and each person gets a hot dog or hamburger and a soda.


