Mike Warren introduced the speaker: Redding Electric Utility Director and Assistant City Manager for the City of Redding, Barry Tippin. Barry reported on the history and current situation of REU. REU has been around 95 years, starting in 1921. At that time, the City didn't approve of the way PG&E was managing the utilities, so the City of Redding bought out PG&E and began REU.

Over the years, Hydro power has been very good for Redding. It started in the 60's with the dams in the north state. In the late 70's to early 80's, the City considered investing in nuclear power and placed it on the ballot; but the response was a resounding "no". As a result of that vote, the City is barred from nuclear power.

and the rest from that power plant. In 2005 that changed due to several reasons, with the result that now only and only 1/3 of power comes from hydro. Barry reported on the impacts of Senate Bill 350, and listed out REU's 2020 Strategic Plan focuses in five areas:

(1) Sustainable financial and business model; (2) the organization must by healthy; (3) improve technology to increase value to the customer; (4) communications must improve; (5) attract, develop, and retain qualified employees.

Barry's message to Rotary is to be active in your community, "let's figure out where our community is going together", he says.
