Program - Cancer Sniffing Dogs



Program presenter and dog trainer **Dina Zaphiris**

Mike Mangas introduced our program today, about how dogs are being trained locally to detect cancer. **Dina Zaphiris**, who is based in Chico, gave a very interesting and informative program about work she is doing in this field.

Dina has been in the forefront of medical scent detection training and has trained the dogs used for two federally funded studies. In 2003 she assisted in dog training 5 dogs to detect early stage lung and breast cancer with 99% accuracy (sensitivity). The study is published in the Journal of Integrative Cancer Therapies.

In 2012 Dina was hired to train 9 more dogs to detect ovarian cancer. This study is currently undergoing peer review and analysis for publication.

Dina also trained 10 dogs to detect urinary tract infections in disabled people. The dogs are trained to detect E.coli, the bacteria that causes a common type of UTI. Disabled people often die from urinary tract infections because of catheter use and the lack of physical sensation. They have no warning signs. Now, the dogs can alert their partners that something is wrong.

People generally don't understand how powerful a tool these cancer-scenting dogs are. Not only are they 98% accurate, but they're also capable of early detection. Radiography (X-Ray) under diagnoses cancer, where the MRI over-diagnoses, or gives false positives, resulting in biopsy and unnecessary surgeries.

One of the more interesting parts of the presentation was an explanation of the power of the canine nose. One example **Dina** gave was comparing how a human can detect a particular perfume in average-sized room, whereas a dog can detect that same perfume in a space the size of a stadium.

There is international interest in this research and the hope is that teams from around the world will come to Chico to learn how to train dogs in their respected countries.

Dina also spoke about the long-time relationship of humans and their dogs. In addition to things that we currently recognize that dogs do for humans, like herding, hunting, tracking, guarding, etc., there is some fascinating history about the human race that we owe to dogs. It's believed that because dogs assisted early humans with tracking, killing, and guarding such prey as woolly mammoths, humans were able to thrive and develop.

The unfortunate message in today's program is that this ground breaking work is still limited to the research phase and has not been approved by the FDA yet. We're all hoping that changes soon.


