


Meeting Date: August 11, 2016

Program: Redding Chief of Police, Rob Paoletti spoke today of current and future activities of his department. He was proud of the success of the Neighborhood Police Unit.

Information from the RPD Webpage: On January 4, 2016, the Redding Police Department announced the implementation of the new Neighborhood Police Unit (NPU). This unit is comprised of one sergeant, one corporal, and four officers. NPU will work out of the patrol division. Their primary mission will focus on long-term solutions to crime in the downtown area and the Hilltop Drive business district. NPU will analyze crime trends in their designated areas and take appropriate enforcement action. This unit will maintain a flexible work week and schedule, as to increase their ability to address crime in our community.

Since January, the NPU has made 588 arrests, 147 for drugs. Over 300 citations, over 130 firearms off the streets.

Most notable, they participated in the closure of the Redding Inn and the Hilltop Lodge which were a source of almost constant calls for service.

Chief Paoletti also spoke of looking into the possibility of bringing a methadone clinic to Redding.

Methadone and similar drugs are used in the treatment of Opioid addiction. Many people become addicted to both legal and illegal opioids. Often the cheapest drug to fuel their addiction is heroin. There is a lot of heroin available in Redding. Once addicted, the addict will often resort to crime to obtain the money to buy more heroin to keep from getting sick.

Methadone and similar drugs are used to keep a heroin addict from becoming sick and suffering withdrawal. Methadone and similar drugs go the nerve receptor sites that heroin or other opioids would attach to and block the ability of heroin or other opioids to access that site. This means that there is no "high" from heroin. There is also sickness or withdrawal.

Methadone, et al, must be taken daily in order to be effective. Since there is no clinic in Redding, 70 people drive roundtrip to Chico every day to receive their Methadone or similar drug. That is almost 55,000 miles per year to receive treatment. It is felt that a clinic in Redding would reduce the rime associated with getting money to buy Heroin by having a safe alternative available. Many people do not have the ability to drive to Chico every day for treatment.
