

Perfecting the Silk Ties Diplomacy

Azi Barzin was born and raised in Tehran, Iran. He came to the United States in 1960 as a student at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He studied electrical engineering, and after graduation he was employed by General Electric. During this time, he met his wife, Alene, and they were married in 1962. Alene comes from Redding, and eventually, the family returned to the north state, following the concerns of political unrest in Iran.

From 1970 to 1980 they had returned to Iran, and Azi continued to work for General Electric, with a primary emphasis on nuclear energy. Azi designed 1110 hsp electrical motors and oversaw its construction. As the political changes in his country became more unsettled, Alene and Azi's son, Dar, moved to the Redding area, and lived with his maternal grandparents. His mother came, and then in 1980 Azi came to Redding. He tried to get work in the 1980's in his profession, but found that he was overqualified for the jobs that were available.

He opened his own consulting firm in Menlo Park, CA, providing safety related expertise in the field of nuclear power plants. As the emphasis on nuclear power diminished, Azi became a consultant for GE, specializing in safety-related items. There was never a nuclear error in the US. For 5 years Azi commuted to the Bay Area every week. Finally, in 1987, Azi sold his business, came home to Redding, and retired. He started to invest in real estate, and became a developer (American Housing Development). Some of the properties that have had his involvement include Hacienda Heights, and Windsor Estates. He then branched out to develop assisted living programs known as Oakdale heights Assisted Living, and Sierra Oaks Senior Living.

Now he chooses his activities. And an active man he is! He enjoys exercise, Alpine skiing, swimming in the lake, boating and weight training. He enjoys duck and dove hunting. He donates his birds to the Anderson Rotary Wild Game Feed. Both his children, Dar, and Kinene (who resides in the Clear Lake area) are active Rotarians as well. And Azi is a man of service above self. He has given years of his expertise to the City of Redding Electric Utilities Commission.

Azi has stories to share! He joined the Rotary Club of Redding in 1988. Then Rotary President John Fitzpatrick assigned him to get involved in Membership Committee, a post he held for many years. He visited many Clubs, and found the Anderson Rotary group and has a unique relationship with the members, who rotate locations for their meetings, and are rather informal. The first time he visited, he learned that they do not encourage members to wear ties, and promptly took scissors to his silk tie. Over the years he has dedicated numerous silk, designer ties to the Anderson group. He even ordered special ties just for his forays to Anderson Rotary. Now he gets ties donated to share.

Azi is very dedicated to Rotary. He states that “The Spillway is one of the best benefits for our members.”

And he believes that our association deserves more recognition for the services that we do, not just for our local community, but internationally. He believes that we have to encourage our Keyway members to work with a team leader with experience, to learn and to appreciate the principles of Rotary membership. And he dedicates time and energy to the international focus locally, with the I-House team. He will take the visitors to Anderson Rotary and surrender a tie, to show that Rotarians can have a lot of fun!

Henderson Phoenix

It is often repeated that a picture is worth a thousand words. However, in the case of the Henderson Phoenix Project, no image can convey the full story. The completed iron colossus speaks volumes about hard work, incredible student talent, artistic expression, intangible ethics of volunteers, historic preservation, resource recovery, political intrigue and quiet dedication over long months and years. This brief review should encourage a visit after the forthcoming transportation and installation. Here is a permanent welcoming presence at Dignity Wellness Center.

In January of 2015 a small band of Redding Rotary Club Stream Team members using a powerful grip hoist on loan from the California Conservation Corp extracted usually submerged steel from the Sacramento River. A dangerous obstruction was over a hundred feet from the bank of Riverview Golf and Country Club. The tangled metal was exposed during low water levels caused by drought conditions. The most likely origin of this material was from a salvage operation in 1956 when large sections of the historic Free Bridge were floated to Cottonwood to become part of a gravel mining operation. Some of the rafts made their destination, at least two did not.

Several hundred pounds of beams, rods, giant buckles and straps were transported to Shasta College. There the Shasta College Welding Club began the task of transformation into what is a truly impressive and permanent work of art. In Greek mythology, a phoenix is a bird related to the sun which regenerates itself from the ashes of its parent. This emblem recognizes and memorializes the power of volunteers. The thirteen foot, eleven and one half inch iron representation with a fourteen foot wing span is dedicated to those who labored to restore Henderson Open Space from a wasteland to an urban natural area in the center of Redding. Likewise, unpaid college students have created a powerful story without words and preserved an important part of this area's history.

Just as the resource which is now recovered, the sculpture stands as a monument to toil over politics, to perseverance over obstruction and difficulty. Rotary can be very proud of its role at Henderson and in helping to articulate this important addition to our community narrative.


Program - Wild Rice in Shasta County

Randy Smith introduced our guest speaker **Hiram Oilar**, owner of Oilar Wild Rice Marketing. As wild rice distributor, he has a wealth of knowledge about the business and history of this crop.

In California, wild rice production was started in 1972 by Vince Vanderford, with an ice chest of wild rice seeds. Current CA wild rice production is about 16,000 acres and is raised by approximately 50 farmers.

In Shasta County, most of the wild rice production takes place in the Fall River Valley area, which is a perfect spot given its high altitude and cold winters. Wild rice needs at least 60 consecutive days of 30 degree or colder weather to germinate.

On the business side of things in the US, annual gross sales is about \$60,000,000 and annual export gross is about \$28,000,00. One of the most surprising things to most people is percentage of wild rice produced in the Shasta County, as shown in the chart to the right.
