Craft Talk: Dan Waldrop gave his craft talk today. Dan has been an optician for 27 years. He has






But, the real story for the Redding area is the millions of dollars that GCID has spent in the Sacramento River as it courses through Redding. Painter's Riffle is pictured below. The

"before" picture is on the left. It shows a gravel bar impeding the river's flow. On the right, the gravel






bar has been removed. The picture below shows salmon spawning beds, (redds) noted by the yellow arrows after the riffle has been restored.



Salmon spawning at repaired Painter's Riffle








