**Teacher of the Year Awards: Kathy Malain** introduced the Teacher of the Year Awards. Each recipient received a plaque and a \$750 stipend for use in their classrooms. There were two recipients, one for Secondary School Teacher of the Year, and one for Elementary/Intermediate School Teacher of the Year. Both recipients demonstrated three outstanding attributes: (1) Passion for teaching, (2) Collegiality and being team players, and (3) Desire to give back to the community and empower their students.

Shelle Peterson, the Superintendent/Principal of University Preparatory School, introduced Lura Wilhelm as the Secondary School Teacher of the Year. Lura is in her fifth year of teaching Art at U-Prep. She currently teaches Sixth Grade Art, Art 1-4, Honors Art, and AP Studio Art. Lura believes that, through art, students are able to be creative and explore solutions to a wide variety of challenges. Lura is an integral part of U-Prep's "Celebration of the Arts" program that showcases all of the school's She is involved in visual and performing arts. numerous community events with her students as well as in her professional artist capacity. Through her efforts, U-Prep students have been involved in the Shasta County Arts Council Annual Juried High School Art Competition, as well as The Arts Alive Show, and the STEAM Art Competition associated with the Makers Faire. For her students, she is not only an excellent teacher, but a role model of the professional artist in the community.

Our own Courtney McElvain (who is the recipient's sister in law), along with Jennifer Severin, the Vice-Principal at Turtle Bay School, introduced Kristin McElvain as the Elementary/Intermediate School Teacher of the Year. Kristin teaches Seventh and Eighth Grade Core (Language Arts and History) at Turtle Bay School. Kristin is a leader at Turtle Bay School and in the Redding School District and is carried in the highest esteem by the students, staff, and school stakeholders with whom she interacts. Kristin is proactive, serving on her school's leadership team and is a Process Champion for Capturing Kids Hearts, helping lead Turtle Bay School to be nominated for a National Showcase School Award. Most important is that every educational decision she makes is to improve the lives of the students she serves. She is creating future citizens who are able to think for themselves.

History of Redding Rotary: In recognition of the 93<sup>rd</sup> Birthday of Redding Rotary, our own Rudy Balma and Lou **Gerard** gave a brief history of the Club. Redding Rotary was founded on April 8, 1924, with meetings at the Golden Eagle Hotel. It originally had only 24 members. Over time, Redding Rotary has chartered five other Rotary Clubs, demonstrating how our Club is interested in sharing the Rotary experience with others. Both **Rudy** and **Lou** related many amusing stories about the Club. There are so many wonderful anecdotes because it is the membership that makes Redding Rotary such a unique club. The Redding Rotary Club has done a great deal for the community, all under the banner of Rotary International. We are all very proud of the work Rotary has done locally and globally. Thank you **Rudy** and **Lou** for reminding us of the excellent work Redding Rotary has done and will continue to do in the future.

Program: President Ray introduced Angela Jones, the Executive Director of One SAFE Place, who gave a presentation on how One SAFE Place provides legal services, safety, and emotional support to intimate partners, children, and seniors affected by domestic violence and sexual assault. One SAFE Place provides intervention and prevention services from its campus located at 2250 Benton Drive in Redding, California. It is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization and provides all of its services free of charge. One SAFE Place partners with several other organizations and agencies to provide a one-stop-shop for clients, volunteers, social workers, bystanders, and donors who are all collaborating to end violence in Shasta County. In 2015, One SAFE Place opened the Sierra Center to provide shelter, food and clothing assistance, and a sense of wellbeing and healing to those affected by domestic violence and sexual assault. In addition, Camp OSP, a camping

program focused on children exposed to domestic violence and related physical and sexual abuse, was established to give children the chance to learn they are not alone in what they have been through and in the value they have moving forward as community members. 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
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
