Catalyst Mentoring Movement

Aaron Hayes honored our Rotary club by presenting information about Catalyst and their mentoring program. Aaron said, "by investing in our youth we are investing in our future."

What is Catalyst? According to their website, Catalyst Mentoring exists to recruit, train, and place 1,000 mentors in Shasta County in the next three years. They are a "DBA" of The Stirring in Redding. Although part of a religious organization, Catalyst's focus is on helping all youth regardless of their spiritual affiliation.

What does Catalyst Do? Catalyst hosts Mentor Launch events, which are opportunities for people to get involved in becoming a mentor. Another of their events is a Mentor Boot Camp, which helps people move from "I Can't" to "I Can". All you really need to do to be a mentor is to care and show up.

How can Rotarians Help? Share the message of Catalyst through social media, or volunteer to become a mentor and help make a difference in the life of a young person with as little as one hour a week. You can also assist a mentor with a monthly donation. These donations: allow Catalyst to recruit, train, and maintain mentors so that more kids can have a life MENTORING changing connection with a healthy adult.



With one in four kids in Shasta County living in poverty and therefor five times more likely to drop out of school, it is now more important than ever that we as Rotarians assist these youth in our community. Catalyst is a means of providing that "service above self". Thank you, Aaron, for speaking with us today!

Model Rotarian Has Clear Vision for Service (Part 2)

Dave and Pat Dennis moved to Redding in 1977 and he started an Optometric practice. He loved being an Optometrist and providing eye care to his patients. During the years he was in practice, the Optometric profession changed very rapidly. It sounds strange, but when he started practice in 1977, Optometrists could not dilate eyes in California. As the laws governing the practice of Optometry changed, he went to hundreds of hours of continuing education to expand the scope of his practice. When he retired in 2012, he was removing foreign bodies from eyes, treating infections and other eye diseases, and was practicing as a primary eye care provider. In 1980 he became a private pilot and for three years flew to the Bay Area weekly to be a clinic instructor at the School of Optometry.

He loved practicing Optometry and providing eye care to his patients. His patients would remark that he had a "happy office". Every day was a joy. In 2012, after 35 years of practice, he sold his business to Kristi Davis, OD and retired.

Dave has always been very active in the community and has served on many boards over the years. He travelled to I-House in Berkeley several times to cement relationships that remain to this day. He and wife Pat opened their home to I-House guests from Ukraine, China, Japan, Thailand, Korea, and many other countries. In June, 1999 he was the Rotarian of the Quarter, and in 2007 he was named the Rotary Club of Redding's Rotarian of the Year.





Blood Source & Joe Ayer

Perhaps Joe Ayer has come up to you once or twice and asked you kindly to give up some of your blood. No, he isn't a vampire - his title is Senior Manager of Recruitment and Hospital Services and he works for Bloodsource.

Bloodsource is a not-for-profit that was founded in 1948, and their business is the collecting and distribution of blood and blood components, products generously donated by people such as yourself. They span much of Northern and Central California, serving over 40

hospitals from Merced to Oregon, Solano County to Lake Tahoe.

Joe manages a few different teams here in Northern California and oversees the distribution to 18 of those hospitals. This first team is responsible for recruiting donors - given before but they haven't seen you in awhile? You will probably be getting a call from one of Joe's staff. He has another small group responsible for the Mobile Blood Drives. I know you've seen the Bloodmobile parked around town and perhaps you've been wanting it to show up in your parking lot someday, Joe manages that team as well. Finally, all that donated blood must go somewhere, and it's important to get where it is most needed - remember, there is a shelf life and they want each drop to get used to help save a life!

Prior to life in Redding or his employment with Bloodsource, Joe was an active Rotarian and Redding is actually his third club. His first club was the Rotary Club of Downy; that was when he was working with the Red Cross in Southern California. After a promotion, Joe and his family were sent to Sacramento and he then joined the Rotary Club of Elk Grove. It is in Sacramento where he first started to work for Bloodsource, and it was another promotion that brought him to Redding, where he made the decision to choose us! During his time in our club, he headed up the bowl-a-thon in his early days in Keyway, and eventually became a board member. Other activities have included the Youth Exchange and Finance committees. His favorite thing about being a Rotarian is seeing

money get spent locally, especially when funds are used for our youth, but he also loves the friendships that one can form in Rotary; they are often strong and life-long bonds.

Joe has a BA in Organizational Leadership, a Masters in Business Administration and is currently an adjunct at Simpson University and Brandman University.


