The Redding Trail Alliance is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation based in Redding that was founded in 2016. Nathan Knudsen was born and raised in the Redding area, loves the outdoors, and has been an avid mountain biker since 1999. In 2016 he and a number of other like-minded enthusiasts set out to improve the available biking trails around Redding.

The mission of the Redding Trail Alliance is to, "create high quality trail experiences by advocating for, building, and maintaining trails which are progressive, diverse, and promote community."

Since their inception as a 501c3 nonprofit in October of 2016 they have accomplished many remarkable tasks including:

- Established a Memorandum of Understanding with the local BLM field office to continue working together on the maintenance of the existing trail system and development of future trails.
- Promotion of community trail usage through sponsoring the following events:
 - ⇒ Occupy Shasta Checkpoint Race
 - ⇒ Redding Mayor's Mountain Bike Challenge
- Spent over 1,000 volunteer hours on trail building and maintenance on projects such as the Wintu Road to Flow Trail Conversion, and the French Fry Trail 58.
- Spent over \$35,000 on trail building, maintenance, and promotion.



Their future projects include:

- **Redding Bike Park**
- Salt Creek Bridge & Trail Reroute
- West Side to Swasey Connection
- Caldwell Junior Bike Park

The Caldwell Junior Bike Park is scheduled for completion this Fall! The project will include an Asphalt Tot Pump Track, a
