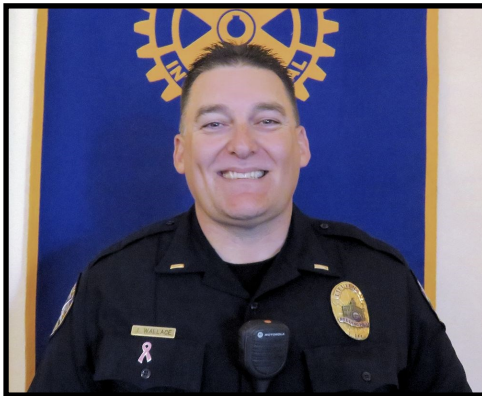




AB 109 - The Consequences of Prop 47 and Prop 57

The first comment from Lt. Wallace that got our attention is Redding is no longer the same place to live that it used to be. Basically there are criminals walking our streets that should be in jail. The problems that have led to this are very complex. With the increase in population there has also been an increase in the number of people that are breaking the law. The very laws that protect us. That said the number of prisons and areas of incarceration have not expanded to meet the demand.

Jeff mentioned that when a person is arrested and brought to jail, a decision must be made. Which of the prisoners already there must be released to make room for the new criminal. There are 381 beds in the County jail. This obviously is a very serious situation. It means there are criminals walking among us.

There are no misdemeanor criminals only felons in the Shasta County jail. A major effect of AB109 is previously serious offences meant you were going to state prison to serve your sentence. After AB109 those committing crimes listed in 1107h of the penal code must be sent to the county jail, not state prison. This is what has led to the overcrowding of all county jails. The propositions 47 and 57 are responsible for this situation. Prop 47 has reduced many criminal offenses from a felony to a misdemeanor.

Health and Safety violations have been reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor. This means people using heroin, methamphetamine and cocaine are getting a ticket instead of going to jail. Also as part of Prop 47 property crimes of \$950 or less are reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor. Criminals understand the law. They are limiting their thefts to under \$950 and receiving a ticket. There are no more commercial burglary charges for an open business. A person can walk into a store and steal a camera valued at \$945 and walk out the door. If caught by security this criminal will receive a ticket as a misdemeanor.

Prop 57 is known as the Safety and Rehabilitation Act. This allows parole consideration for persons convicted of non-violent felonies upon completion of their prison term. It authorizes the California Department of Corrections to award credits for rehab, good behavior, or educational achievements. Juvenile court judges shall make determination upon a prosecutors motion whether juveniles age 14 and older should be prosecuted and sentenced as adults for specific offenses. This was previously decided by the prosecutor.

There doesn't appear to be an easy way to improve the situation. Clearly something has to be done to help law enforcement protect all of us.

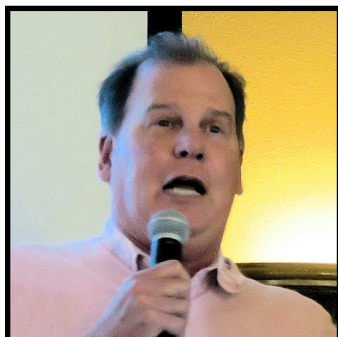
