Internet Safety: Who is Watching



Shasta County Deputy District Attorney, Sarah Murphy gave Redding Rotary a look at what goes on in the world of cell phones, the Internet and cyber crime. Sarah started off with a comment that should get everyone's attention. She said "children don't understand the ramifications of sending pictures and comments from a cell phone." Her presentation asked several questions. First, was why are we concerned? Children as young as three wake up in the morning and check their cell phone. It is the last thing they do before going to bed at night. How does this behavior effect our children emotionally and psychologically?

Every cell phone that sends out a message has a Digital Footprint. Each of these devices is communicating with all the cell phones near by. This allows for the trans-

Each of these devices is communicating with all the cell phones near by. This allows for the transmission of data to the servers of the manufacturers of the cell phone. Unfortunately this information is also distributed over the Internet which means it can be seen by everyone on the Internet. What the children are missing is there are a number of people with access to their information who want to do them harm. Children seem to be living only in the present. What could happen in the future is not considered at all.

Sarah discussed Sexting. The is the sending of sexually explicit information over the Internet. The can be messages, photos or video. Once the person hits send, the sent materials are out there forever. There are several Federal organizations that store this information in an attempt to fight and prosecute those engaged in child pornography. If anyone retains a photo or video of a child showing sexual acts or lascivious exhibitions of genitals, they would be guilty of child pornography.

There are several applications that parents should be aware of. The first mentioned was Yellow App. This app has been linked to a multitude of teen sexting. Others include Hooking up, Plenty of Fish, Match, Kaboom and Confide. If you suspect your child has participated in texting activity, look at their cell phone. Check the apps for any suspicious names including those mentioned.

Another major problem today is Cyber Bullying. This is bullying that takes place using electronic technology. This includes cell phones, computers, tablets social media sites, text messages, chat and websites. When we mention cyber bullying its usually children up to the age of 18. Many states have laws and criminal penalties for bullying but as of yet the use of electronic media to do

this is not as well documented. Through the use of text messages your friend for life today is history by the end of the week. What we are dealing with is a relationship in the electronic world without any physical association. How well can you know someone you have never seen. Children and even adults who get caught up in "on line relationships", feel the same grief of breaking up as those who communicate face to face. This has resulted in suicide on some cases.

Notably, if someone obtains one of those sexting images and uses them against a child or teen, the results can be catastrophic. The entire school can see these images. The effects on the person being exploited can linger for a lifetime and even lead to suicide.

Before the development of cell phones and the use of the Internet, people could make a mistake and forget about it. Today, mistakes made over the Internet last for a lifetime. It is extremely important for parents to be close to their children. Know what they are doing. Be there for help and advice. Most important, if one of these bullying situations occurs, be there with understanding and help. **Sometimes the child's life depends on it.**




