

Three things he discussed that are frequent causes of homelessness are a **Dr. Douglas McMullin** lack of a family safety net, financial issues, and disease including mental

health and physical health. He also revealed that the average lifespan for a person living on the streets in the USA is 47 years. "If you can provide them a locked door, a bed, a shower, and a fridge you extend their expected life span by 20 years," he said.

He explained that homelessness comes in many forms, and that many of those on the street want to be off the streets. He and his volunteer team have found ways to successfully help get people the medical, financial, and mental help that they need to get back on their feet and to be self-sufficient.

Dr. McMullin's graphic imagery of the real face of homelessness brought home his point that, "This could be your story... anyone can be homeless." His compassion and willingness to help other is commendable.
