Recognitions

President Greg took a different approach to recognitions this week by giving voice to those who have been impacted by or are responding to the Carr Fire. No fines were levied this week

- **Parvin Carter** relayed her harrowing account of her and her husband's escape from the fire. Kudos to Dave Dennis for showing us all what compassion looks like as he came to her side, giving her a shoulder to lean on.
- **Barry Tippin** was recognized for all that he and the employees of the city are doing for our community. Barry shared the heartbreak the city is feeling from the loss of our Chief a few weeks ago and a fire inspector last week.
- Leslie Morgan shared with us the goal of the Assessor's Office to have revisions to assessments in place before this year's tax bills go out. Also they are looking at the possibility of waiving fees to replace vital documents like birth certificates, etc.
- **Amelia Ward** is working on a project that is similar in nature to one that was done in the Sonoma area last week. She'll have more information next week.
- Kristi Davis told us that she reached out Allergan, one of her suppliers, and they sent her 40 cases of eye drops that she is making available to our community. Also, she is working with the survivors of the fire to get them replacement eyeglasses and contact lenses.
- **Sarah Fernandez** made us aware of the need for volunteers at Simpson University as they serve as an evacuation center.
- **Bret Christensen** shared that an addition to the Club's website has been done to be a place for information moving forward.
- **Rick Hill** made us aware of a bar/restaurant in Chicago is conducting a huge fundraiser to benefit the survivors of the Carr Fire.
- **Dan Waldrop** made us aware of a program that he had setup sometime ago, a 501(c)(3), to provide replacement prescription eye wear to those in need, and is making that program available to survivors of the fire.

Program

Randy Smith introduced our speaker today, Lane Carlson. Lane is the Principal of California Heritage Youth Build Academy (CHYBA). CHYBA is alternative school program for at-risk students aged from high school freshmen to adults up to 24 years of age.

The program, which is affiliated with AmeriCorps and the national Department of Labor as a Youth Build school, takes a personalized approach with its students. Although the primary focus is in the building trades, programs in nursing assistance, culinary arts, gardening, wood shop, and others are made available to the students.

A key part of what the school is offering its students is growth in the area of relationship building and trust. This has been facilitated with the help of a mentoring program with the Catalyst group in town.

Lane shared with us that he is looking to individuals in our community, like our club's membership, to help with things like internships, job shadowing, business site tours, and mentorship.
