Editor's note: When I visited my high school recently, there was a sign that said, "Show me your friends, I'll tell you your future". I think young people need to hear this.


Aaron also mentioned how it is important for successful people to participate as speakers and mentors in this program. He invited Rotarians to help with their project by participating.
