Program: President Greg introduced **McGregor ("Greg") Scott**, **Stephanie Bridgett**, and **Lucky Jesrani**, to talk to the Club about Disaster Fraud. **Greg** is the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of California. **Stephanie** is the Shasta County District Attorney and **Lucky** is a Deputy District Attorney and head of the Office's Consumer Protection Unit.

Whenever there is a major disaster, such as the Carr Fire, fraudsters attempt to capitalize on the situation and people have to be on guard. Most types of Disaster Fraud are handled by the District Attorney's Office, but some types of Disaster Fraud that involve federal funds or programs are handled by the U.S. Attorney's Office. Since the Carr Fire, the District Attorney's Office has received over 80 complaints related to Disaster Fraud and the Office has filed in excess of 15 cases. Common Disaster Fraud claims include (1) Unlicensed Contractors, (2) Charity Scams, (3) Disaster Relief/FEMA Scams, and (4) Price Gouging. Should anyone believe they have been a victim of Disaster Fraud, assistance is available.




