He talked about membership and reminisced about the people he has met and the friends he has made in Rotary. He challenged the audience to close their eyes and think about the first two or three people in their club that come to mind, then ask themselves if they would be friends with those people if they hadn't joined Rotary. Likewise, he asked the audience again to close their eyes and think about people who have left the club and ask themselves if they still see those people. He




**Team Captains**



**PP Amelia Ward** announced several Paul Harris Fellows (see list below) that were awarded on behalf of District 5160 to for their volunteer works of compassion during the Carr Fire. She listed the following traits of a volunteer: generosity, understanding, empathy, compassion, and patience.

- Tucker Zimmerman was a Point of Contact during the fire. He delegated, provided transportation to and from the Fire Evacuation zones. He received Donations and coordinated their distribution throughout Shasta, Tehama, Lake, and Mendocino Counties and worked with all the local agencies in our area.
- **Cody Jones** owns the Bob Jones Arena in Cottonwood, he allowed the use of the Rodeo grounds and serve as their mentor
- **Bailey Spitz** stayed at the Arena 24 hours a day to provide a point of contact and to watch over the Livestock while others rested and recovered each night to keep going the next day.
- Joe Cameron also assisted in transporting livestock to and from Evacuation points and assisted in moving livestock into stalls throughout the Rodeo grounds. He also was a Dozer operator for Cal Fire and worked on the Fire lines at night
- **Cameron Jones** was responsible for receiving the livestock, organizing their feed plans and kept a record of the names of the owners.
- Serena Harris was also responsible for receiving the livestock, organizing their feed plans and recorded the names of the owners to their animal.
- **Thomas Goerss** also assisted in transporting livestock to and from Evacuation and assisted in moving livestock into stalls throughout the Rodeo grounds.
- **Dr. Steve Loncosky and Dr. Kevin Terra** are from the Cottonwood Veterinary Clinic, they both provided health checks and also performed assistance in giving treatment to Livestock that needed medical help.


