Program: United Airlines Redding to Los Angeles

There have been several airlines operating out of Redding Muni over the years. For one reason or another they all seem to disappear after several years. There is an ongoing effort to establish a new route with United Airlines from Redding to Los Angeles.

At a recent meeting we heard primarily from Redding Airport Manager Bryant Garrett with help from fellow Rotarian, Steve Williams and Redding City Manager, Barry Tippin. The effort is for a United Airlines route to Los Angeles. There are several reasons for this. Primarily many local Redding business men do business in Los Angeles. The new route will allow for those doing business in L.A. to return home in the evening. Also mentioned was the new route would bypass the delays due to fog in San Francisco, driving to Sacramento and parking fees for the car. The direct flight would be less expensive. Find below the slides presented at the meeting showing all the details.

Why We Need to Do This

- · Expanding business and supplier opportunities
- · Build pathways to better recruitment of new talent
- · More efficient access to universities in SoCal
- · Better connections for many families, originally from LA
- Increased business for local merchants, hotels, restaurants, and tourist destinations
- · Increased availability of destinations for our quality of life
- · Reliable business connections, eliminate fogs with SFO fog
- · Increased alternatives if there are equipment of weather issues

What We Need

- · Connections to interested parties:
 - o Those who will benefit from additional air service
 - Could be local people/organizations that travel to our area frequently
 - Parties that see the possibilities created by expanding air service that may want to "prime-the-pump" for future additional destinations
 - Displace our vision to secure an additional routes such as Denver, Portland, others in the future.

Some very good questions followed the presentation. The first was how will the waived landing fees and other incentives be compensated for? The answer from Bryant Garrett was increased parking rental revenue, increased rental car funds and fuel revenues.

Steve Williams representing the Economic Development Corporation said flying directly from Redding not only allows him to be home at night after a busy day in L.A. but the cost of connecting flight fees and delays in San Francisco make the direct L.A. flight very attractive.

It is hoped that the "Revenue Guarantee Fund" will never be used. All that is needed is an additional \$215,875.00 to go forward. It is projected all this will happen in the next 30 to 60 days.

Dar Barzin, the Count Dracula of Redding Rotary



Dar, the son of Azi Barzin, joined Redding Rotary in 1999, and our club is his first and only Rotary Club. Following in his father's footsteps, he has nearly a twenty year history of service above self, especially service to our club.

His mother and father met at Shasta College and Dar was born in San Jose. He moved to Iran with his Dad in 1979, and was there for about three years. He returned because of the revolution. Azi had to stay behind for an additional three years. Upon his return to Redding, where his mother and grandparents lived, Dar endured bullying because he was "the Iranian."

Dar attended Redding Schools, going to Mistletoe, Enterprise High, and Shasta College. He then went to Chico State, where he earned a B.S. in psychology. He just about finished a masters' program, but struggled with burn out. It was about this time that his grandmother needed residential care. Soon after, Dar had the opportunity to open a 6 bed RCFE (licensed residential care facility for

the elderly).

As an administrator of these types of programs, Dar expanded his business, operating Residential Care Management Services, and TLC Services. He now has 4 Intermediate Care Facilities for the developmentally disabled, at a nursing level.

Because of his skills and sensitivity to individuals with developmental disabilities, he has taken over three specialized treatment facilities licensed through the State's Community Care Licensing program. He has approximately 70 staff working for his companies, and providing 24/7 support for his residents. His programs are closely scrutinized by the State and by Far Northern Regional Center, whose confidence resulted in his being encouraged to expand into the specialized care home arena.

One title given to administrators like Dar is "Care Provider." Dar is definitely a provider of care. He and his staff are the residents' only family. And as Dar says, "they're my family." Dar's profession exemplifies what Albert Schweitzer wrote: "The purpose of human life is to serve, and to show compassion and the will to help others." Dar sees his residents like fellow Rotarians. At the end of the day, it's not about what you have, or what you've accomplished. It's about who you've lifted up, and what you've given back.

Dar and his wife, Keli, married in 2006. As a game nerd, he frequented the game store at the Mount Shasta Mall, where the manager caught his eye, and soon his heart. Keli and Dar have 4 legged kids (6 dogs and 1 cat). All are rescued, and Keli is involved in "Save the Nor Cal Rescue." Most of their dogs were foster dogs who just stayed on.

Azi got Dar involved in Rotary, and since that time, Dar has taken on many important responsibilities. He is membership Director on the Board and admits to being on the Board "forever". In addition, he serves on the audio visual team, heads up the Rotary Blood Drive, works on the Thanksgiving Project, and has been a team captain.

Dar and Keli are active, especially enjoying water sports and adventures. Dar likes boating, fly fishing, and Rotary.

One of the most important facets of Rotary for Dar is the friendships. He believes the connections and the collaborations make Rotary unique and special. As a result, Dar encourages all members, new, and not-so-new, to get out and interact. "The older Rotarians will give you knowledge, and the young will keep you young."


