**Program: Dr. Cajun James**, who received her PhD from Cal (Go Bears!), presented a very interesting and thought provoking program about post fire timber harvesting and forest management. She is currently the

turbidity as a measure of sediment erosion.

Research and Monitoring Manager at Sierra Pacific Industries.

**Dr. James** reviewed her research which studied how soon to go into a severely burned area and what were the Best Management Practices to reduce erosion and degradation of water quality, as well as enhance the recovery of the burned area.

Often catastrophic fires occur in late summer or early fall in the Western United States. As a result, the fall and winter rains may soon follow causing erosion in the watershed area. Erosion control to start the healing process and to prevent water quality degradation is very important.

**Dr. James** has studied, and continues to study the effects of logging on the recovery process. She has set up control areas, sediment dams, and other monitoring systems to study water


I reviewed her research paper, **Immediate Post-Fire Salvage Logging, Soil Erosion, and Sediment Delivery**, published in Oxford Forest Science in June 2018. This was a four-year study following the Ponderosa Fire. During her talk today and in her paper, she pointed out that following a fire, the unlogged areas had higher levels of erosion that the logged areas. This was felt to be due to the increased ground disturbance in the logging areas. This disturbance allowed rain to soak into the subsoil rather than running off and causing erosion and increased sediment deposition into the area's streams.


I quote: "The first two years of data indicated that these common salvage logging operations and their associated treatment levels reduced post-fire erosion in comparison to the high severity burned and untreated landscape and that they can be implemented as Best Management Practices. While logging ground disturbance generally results in greater erosion, in this circumstance the salvage logging ground disturbance actually reduced the sediment yield from the burned swales. That relationship highlights the extent to which high-severity fire alone (with litter, duff, and ground cover removal) is a major hydrologic landscape disturbance resulting in substantial erosion."

The conclusion was that going in as soon as possible to conduct salvage logging is a beneficial erosion control practice. Very interesting program.
