Brian Grigsby, the Science Department Chair at Shasta High School, shared with the club information about their Space Science and Engineering program. There are three main high schools from Redding that participate in the program including Shasta High School, Enterprise High School, and Foothill High School. They have developed several courses over the last several years to help their students learn to be a strong workforce.

Part of this program includes VEX Robotics Application where the kids design and build robots as part of the curriculum while learning planning, process, execution, and teambuilding. They compete in a VEX Robotics Competition near the end of the class.

While this is an exciting program that the students seem to enjoy, the benefit of it includes catching their attention to the rest of the world of science, engineering, and mass manufacturing. The school also offers programming that includes computer coding in various languages, drone airplane lessons and rules in an attempt to get the kids FFA Certified as drone pilots, as well as engineering courses including space science, robotic, exploring, manufacturing, and the use of Computer Aided Drafting (CAD).

The program has grown a lot over the years. Five years ago there was only one robotics team at Shasta High School. Now they have, "25 teams across the region and each is developing their own program at their high schools or middle schools," Brian says. Shasta High School has several teachers working on the curriculum, five or more periods of class a day, and a new Science Engineering facility is being built at Shasta High School that will include both labs and classroom space. This is an exciting time to be a Shasta High student!

Brian shared information on a few of the projects the Shasta High students are currently working on. The first is called Knight Wolf. The students are developing a satellite that is planned to be launched into space in 2020! The satellite size is pretty small, but the kids are involved in the designing and building of this satellite.

Another is Project SKOUT (Shasta's Kinect Observing Underground Terrain). The kids were tasked by NASA Ames Research Center to develop a rover based on the NASA design of the rover known

as Project Braille. The kids took an Xbox One and using the Kinect part of the device as the optical sensor, they designed, built, and programmed their own rover called Project SKOUT.

Brian shared with us stories of some of their past students who have gone on to have excellent careers in engineering and science as further proof this program has value and is making a positive impact in student's lives.


