Today's Program - Klean Kanteen

Jennifer Finnegan introduced the speaker for today's program, Caroliegh Pierce, Non Profit Outreach Director for Klean Kanteen, a Chico-based company. Klean Kanteen, a family and employee-owned company, has been in business for 15 years and sells its various products to 43 countries world wide. Their products provide an alternative to single-use beverage products which are typically made from plastic, polystyrene and the like, with products made primarily from stainless steel and baked enamel.

In addition to distributing their eco-friendly and BPA free products, this company of 75 employees strives to make a difference in communities by serving a diverse group of non-profits - over 40 in all. Their contributions to these groups include financial contributions, product donations, and hands-on volunteer work.

In their fight against single-use waste, Klean Kanteen promotes the concept of #bringyourown beverage containers to combat the following statistics regarding plastics:

- 8 million metric tons of plastic enter our oceans each year
- 1 in 4 fish tested have plastic in their gut
- In the US we use 500 million straws per day
- 98% of plastic pollution in the ocean comes from land
- By 2050 there could be more plastic in the oceans than fish (by weight).


