

#### **Literacy Program Update**



Fellow Rotarians, **Wendy Dickens** and **Peggy O'Lea** were our presenters this week discussing Literacy Programs. Wendy gave a brief overview on First 5 Shasta's programs including: Prevention; Policy Advocacy, and System Change (ACEs). She used illustrations to show why good educational development at an early age is essential in a child's life.

Wendy, Peggy, and President Greg (left to right) She showed the differences in synapse formation in a child's brain from 36 weeks in gestation through 6 years of age (below).


She emphasized the critical transition that takes place in third grade, "until the end of third grade most students are learning to read. After

that they're reading to learn." Children who aren't successful at learning to read by third grade regularly fall behind their classmates and continue to struggle throughout their school careers. Wendy talked about the importance of parents interacting with their children and gave examples of

ways that Rotary is helping to encourage early literacy.

Peggy O'Lea joined Wendy at the podium to talk about our club's Literacy Committee efforts and programs. She discussed their focus on, "community-wide investment in early childhood literacy to ensure that all kids enter kindergarten with the tools they need to be successful."

The committee is currently focusing on ways to improve birth-to-kindergarten literacy with

a goal of improving kindergarten readiness and third grade reading proficiency for all kids.

The committee tries to leverage Rotary funding and investment for the greatest impact. They're now part of a large regional collaborative focused on the "cradle-to-career" skills and education experiences that our kids need to have to be successful as adults.

Wendy wrapped up the presentation with more information on Reach Higher Shasta's program

including Library Book Incentives, Cypress School's book incentive and absenteeism initiative, a book Bag program, and lastly Free Little Libraries that can be found around Redding. Programs such as Reading Rotarians, and Shasta Early Literacy partnership for Free Little Libraries were some examples given. The Free Little Libraries can be found around Redding and sport the phrase, "Take a book, Return a book."

Wendy closed by adding that more Free Little Library houses are needed and suggested that perhaps some of our fellow Rotarians might be interested in this project. Please contact Wendy Dickens if you'd like to help!




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
