**Program:** Tony Giovaniello introduced fellow Rotarian Dr. Norman Hall, President of Simpson University. Dr. Hall talked with the Club about the development of Simpson University. Simpson University is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). It has received four awards for Colleges of Distinction. The School of Nursing has been listed as being one of the best nursing schools in the country and was ranked # 8 in California in Careers' annual ranking. Simpson has developed an Associate Degree Transfer (ADT) program so that students who obtain an associate's degree from Shasta College can then easily transfer to Simpson to obtain their bachelor's degree. Simpson has North also established numerous State Legacy Scholarships to assist students in the area in being able to attend the school. In 2017, Simpson was awarded five federal grants, in excess of \$10.5 million, whose main objectives were to ensure students completed their

secondary education and then pursued post-secondary education. Simpson also recently received a \$500,000 grant to develop digital media. Simpson is a significant economic driver for the area, with an \$83 million economic impact for the local six county region, and a \$61 million economic impact in the City of Redding. Thank you **Dr. Hall** for sharing with the Club the importance that Simpson University has for the community and the education of our future generations.
