### **Treatments for Joint Ailments**

Dr. Eric Jenkinson is a member of the medical staff at Shasta Orthopedics. Dr. Jenkinson discussed the alternatives for treatment of joint disease.

### What are my options?

The first thought presented was how medicine has evolved today. Dr. Jenkinson said medicine is no longer a care profession but has become a business. Money plays an important part of what treatment and care is available to the patient. The cost of procedures and treatments have changed the way cases are handled. This affects the insurance market drastically. The increase in cost of medi-

cine automatically causes an increase in insurance premiums.



### Supplements

Treatments mentioned were Glucosamine and chondroitin. This type of medication is directed for alleviating pain. These medications have been used successfully for some time. Another type of medication is Tumeric. This is a natural spice that is an anti-inflammatory. Also mentioned was hyaluronic acid which is used to replace joint synovial fluid. Next in line was CBD or Cannabidiol from the hemp plant. This is used for pain, insomnia and anxiety. Another benefit is the alleviation of cancer-related symptoms. It may also reduce acne and have some neuroprotective properties. Some say CBD can benefit heart health.

### Injections

Cortisone is a well known anti-inflammatory medication. These are glucocorticoids and should be used carefully. Those with diabetes need to be very careful using it. Visco supplementation is an injection that acts like WD-40 inside the joint. Biologics are another way to treat arthritis. Stem cell research is using the primordial cell to regenerate cartilage. This method is in its infancy and shows considerable promise. Other injections include Orthoflow and Aminofix. These injectables are used to promote joint healing. The last injectable mentioned was PRP. The full name is Platelet Rich Plasma. This injection is also used to promote healing. Dr. Jenkinson says be prepared for severe pain for about five days before the beneficial effects kick in.

### Exercise

Dr. Jenkinson emphasized exercise and staying mobile. He mentioned when we are in our 20's and 30's we train for sports. When in our 40's and 50's we train for our businesses and jobs. When in our 60's and above we train for life.

Dr. Jenkinson responding to a question mentioning the cost of medications comes from some basic costs in medication development. The cost of research is where much of the initial product costs come from. This means new drugs with a patent and no generic form are very pricey. After seven years the patent runs out and the generics come on line at a much reduced price.




