Program: President Jeff introduced Dan Blair, who works in the Government Relations/Public Affairs Group for Pacific Gas & Electric. Dan spoke to the Club about PG&E's Community Wildfire Safety Program. PG&E monitors wildfire risks 24/7 from its Wildfire Safety Operations Center. As part of its enhanced wildfire safety efforts, PG&E is also conducting accelerated safety inspections of electric infrastructure in areas of higher wildfire risk. Beginning with the 2019 wildfire season, PG&E expanded its Public Safety Power Shutoff program to include all electric lines that pass through high fire-threat areas - both distribution and transmission. The most likely electric lines to be considered for shutting off for safety are those that pass through areas that have been designated by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) as at elevated (Tier 2) or extreme (Tier 3) risk for wildfire. The CPUC's High Fire-Threat District Map was adopted in 2018 accessed January and can be

cpuc.ca.gov/FireThreatMaps. While the most likely electric lines to be considered for shutting off for safety will be those that pass through high fire-threat areas, any PG&E electric customer could be impacted and should be prepared. 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
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
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


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
