PP Greg Dunbar read a very touching letter from Karen C., a Carr fire survivor, who thanked our club for its






Rick Plummer

Program: PP Ed Rullman introduced our new Chief of Police, Bill Schueller. Chief Schueller joined RPD

in 1994 and has served in most if not all departments. For the last five years, he has managed the installation of new and comprehensive software to tie in the law enforcement agencies in the county.

Chief Schueller gave us an update on the status of the Police Department and reviewed some crime statistics in the Redding Area. He pointed out that major crimes are down 8% in 2019, although it was not clear if the incidence of crimes was really lower or if people just weren't reporting them due to citizen frustration. He furthered cautioned that the data was preliminary and may change in the next few weeks.

He pointed out that Redding is a large city with 60 square miles to patrol. It is divided into seven sections so there are seven police patrolling the 60 miles and that this is pretty thin. Although Redding has continued to grow in population with increased police responsibilities and demands, we had 119 sworn officers in 2008

and only 107 today. This is actually a small improvement as there were only 98 in 2014.

Several things have helped. CSOs or Community Services Officers are able to take reports of car accidents s, burglaries, and other nonviolent crimes. This frees sworn officers to do patrol, investigations, and be more proactive in the community. In 2008 there were 15 CSOs which dropped to 3 from 2012 to 2015. It is now back up to 11 which should help with response times and backlogs.

He spoke of the Neighborhood Police Unit which is a proactive force not tied to the radio or dispatch. They have been very effective in the four years they have been operating. They have made 1089 felony arrests, 711 misdemeanor arrests, and contacted over 9,100 individuals. They have actively made arrests at downtown motels as well as residences, interrupted drug sales, assisted in sting operations in child sexual predator cases, among many many more cases. He noted that Bethel donated \$500,000 to keep the NPU operating.

He spoke of the Community Cleanups of homeless camps. This is an ongoing problem that seems to be increasing. In 2018 the Police Department working with other agencies and organizations removed 338,000 pounds of waste from homeless camps. By 2019 the amount removed had increased to 408,000 pounds.

He spoke of the upcoming Measure A. From the money that would be allotted to the City of Redding, the police department would receive an estimated 4.9 million dollars. That would allow another 11 sworn offices, 4 additional investigators, as well as additional training and equipment. Needless to say, this would be very helpful.

Thank you Chief Schueller for a very interesting enlightening program.

Riverview is increasing our catering costs effective January 1. Due to this price increase, RCR will be raising the weekly meeting fee to \$19.00 effective February 1, 2020.

Make-up meetings and guest meeting fees will now be \$20.00.

History:

As of January 1, 2020, we will be paying \$18.00 per meal plus a \$250 monthly room charge to Riverview.

Riverview increased our lunch cost by 81 cents effective October 2017, bringing our meal cost to \$17.06, plus a \$250 monthly room charge. There was no meeting fee increase passed along to the members by RCR at this time.

The last time we raised meeting fees was in July 2008, when our meeting fee was raised to \$18.00.

A breakdown on what your \$19.00 weekly meeting fee goes towards:

\$14.58 is food

\$2.16 is surcharge (gratuity)

\$1.26 is sales tax

Total per meal is \$18.00 to Riverview

The remaining \$1.00 goes toward our monthly room charge of \$250.00


