**Open World Delegation: Kathy Anderson** provided the Club with an update on the Open World delegates from Belarus. From December 6-14, 2019, five young business Open World delegates from Belarus were hosted by our Rotary Club. The Open World Leader Center is an independent government agency of the U.S. Congress. Open World awards grants to U.S. nonprofit and educational organizations, who partner with community based civic and service organizations to provide local hosting and programming for the Open World delegates. This program has hosted over 27,000 leaders in all 50 states since 1999. Through hosts and clubs such as Redding Rotary, the Open World program provides delegates first-hand experience with American community life, government and learning from professionals in their field.

When they arrived, the delegates went to a great party with host families at Jason and Irene Salter's home. On Monday, delegates were greeted by City Manager Barry Tippin; Laurie Baker talked about the Business of Tourism and acquainted them with our region's beauty and offerings; the Shasta Historical Society gave a brief presentation on Redding's history; and Jake Mangas, Rachel Hatch and Daniel Knott of K2 spent the afternoon with them as they toured the downtown area. The delegates spent Tuesday with EDC's Tony Giovaniello and Todd Brown, and were hosted by Scott Putnam at APEX followed up by a presentation by Michelle Nystrom. They attended the Rotary Christmas party and gave a video presentation about Belarus. Wednesday morning they were interviewed by Carl and Linda Bott at KNCR Radio, then off to Shasta College to meet Eva Jimenez and staff, have a tour of the campus and lunch at the Bistro, then to Simpson University to round out the afternoon and be interviewed by KRCR's Mike Mangas. They spent Thursday in Chico with Nortec staff, the Chico City Manager, Chico Chamber representatives, and listened to a presentation by Chico State Center for Economic Development and the Center for Entrepreneurship. Friday the delegates were treated to Turtle Bay Exploration Park, ate lunch at Mosaic and toured Shasta Caverns. Friday evening **Dennis and Amelia Ward** held the farewell party. Saturday the group flew out of Redding. Tears and hugs all over! The host families and Club made the Delegation feel welcome and, as usual, stepped up to the plate to give them the best program!

Program: Ed Rullman introduced our new Shasta County Sheriff, Eric Magrini. Sheriff Magrini informed the Club about new programs that are currently in the works in the Sheriff's Office and also informed the Club as to how his office would be impacted if Measure A, the 1% Public Safety Transactions and Use Tax on the March ballot, were to be adopted by a 2/3 vote of Shasta County voters. New programs in the Sheriff's Office already being implemented include the following: (1) Medication Assisted Treatment, which is a 12 bed pilot program for inmates in the jail to receive substance abuse and other rehabilitation services while in custody and on-going treatment after release through Empire Recovery; and (2) a Jail Based Competency Program, which is designed to provide restoration to competency services immediately in the jail for those persons deemed incompetent to stand trial, instead of waiting months to send them to a State Hospital when a bed becomes available. Sheriff Magrini also spoke about Measure A. Measure A. is a special tax, which can provide approximately \$31 million annually for the specific public safety programs outlined in the measure. With Measure A, the Sheriff's Office will be able to provide the following: (1) two new deputies and a community resource officer for the City of Shasta Lake: (2) 20 new deputies to patrol the unincorporated area of the County; (3) the creation of a new detention facility and staffing; (4)

and additional inmate rehabilitation programs. **Sheriff Magrini** stated he is going to attempt innovative strategies to address the issues of public safety in Shasta County. Thank you **Sheriff Magrini** and we wish you much success!

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


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


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
