Program: Leslie Morgan introduced Division Chief Nick Truax who runs the Sugar Pine Conservation

Camp in conjunction with the Shasta County Fire Department. It is located east of Palo Cedro and typically has 90 to 120 inmates. **Chief Truax** related some information about the Sugar Pine Conservation Camp. The following information was excerpted from the camp's webpage and edited by me. It was a very interesting program and it is clear that the camp provides a great service to the state and specifically to Shasta County.

Camp History: The Camp opened June 24, 1988. The California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR) and the California Department of Forestry and Fire

Protection (Cal Fire) jointly operate the Camp. The primary mission of the camp is to provide inmate fire crews for fire suppression principally in the Shasta County area and throughout the state. In addition to fire suppression, inmate hand crews provide a work force for floods, conservation projects, and community services.

Camp Products: Sugar Pine Camp has a Cal Fire Engraving Shop staffed with inmate workers. The engraving Shop produces signs, plaques, nameplates for various agencies.

The Cal Fire Cabinet Shop is also staffed with inmate workers and produces everything from beautiful oak cabinets to one of a kind birdhouse. Some of the projects that are completed by the inmates are donated to charity programs such as Victims of Crime and the Women's Refuge.

Community service projects: During the calendar year, Sugar Pine Conservation Camp, through conservation and work projects, provided the local communities, State Agencies, and Federal Agencies with tens of thousands of work hours. In addition to project and conservation work, the inmate fire crews provided tens of thousands of hours in firefighting and flood work. It is estimated through Sugar Pine's emergency responses to fires, floods, and project work, the inmates provided a cost avoidance to the taxpayers of California of millions of dollars.

Inmate Programs: Inmates can participate in hobby crafts programs and other leisure time activities during their off-work hours. Visiting is conducted during weekends, and families can bring a picnic lunch for the visit. There are also spiritual services and recovery programs provided by community volunteers. One of the highlights of the year is the Annual Community Appreciation Car "Show & Shine", sponsored by the local community. With these benefits, inmates quickly learn that life in a conservation camp is preferable to life behind the walls of a prison and, therefore, conduct themselves accordingly.

Sugar Pine Conservation Camp hosts a variety of programs in conjunction with local volunteers.


