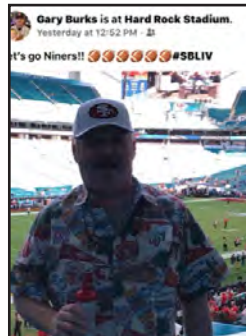

Today's Program - LAVA Charter School

Jennifer Finnegan introduced our speaker for the today's program, **Jake Fuller**, Director of LAVA Charter School.

LAVA (Lassen Antelope Volcanic Academy) Charter School, located in Red Bluff, was chartered in 2016 and opened with 62 students, and 3 teachers. Now in their fourth year, the school has 98 students and 5 teachers. Founded as safe place for students who among other things need a fresh start, the school has found itself home to many students who have a troubled family life. LAVA's teaching strategy includes a focus on life skills, social skills, sports, and a priority on hands-on outdoor learning experiences.

It's this last point that has lead to a relationship with Lassen National Park, where field trips, including overnight camping trips take place at the Park. For many students, these outings are their first camping experience. Outcomes from these trips include binding with peers, an appreciation for the outdoors and sense of stewardship for the environment.

Riverview is increasing our catering costs effective January 1. Due to this price increase, RCR will be raising the weekly meeting fee to \$19.00 effective February 1, 2020.

Make-up meetings and guest meeting fees will now be \$20.00.

History:

As of January 1, 2020, we will be paying \$18.00 per meal plus a \$250 monthly room charge to Riverview.

Riverview increased our lunch cost by 81 cents effective October 2017, bringing our meal cost to \$17.06, plus a \$250 monthly room charge. There was no meeting fee increase passed along to the members by RCR at this time.

The last time we raised meeting fees was in July 2008, when our meeting fee was raised to \$18.00.

A breakdown on what your \$19.00 weekly meeting fee goes towards:

\$14.58 is food

\$2.16 is surcharge (gratuity)

\$1.26 is sales tax

Total per meal is \$18.00 to Riverview

The remaining \$1.00 goes toward our monthly room charge of \$250.00

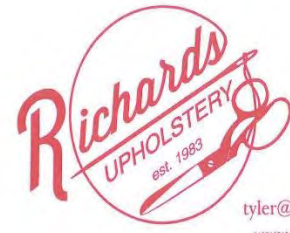
