


Meeting Date: August 6th 2020


Where is President Jake? For today's meeting, President Jake was at Kid's Kingdom (virtually) with Kim Niemer, the City of Redding's Community Services Director. Kim informed the Club about the renovated playground installed at Kid's Kingdom approximately three years ago. It is the only playground north of Sacramento designated as a universal playground, open for children of all abilities. Kim also announced that the new Pickle Ball Court has opened. Due to the restrictions related to COVID-19, all of the City's park facilities have seen an increase in use. Thank you for the update Kim!



Joe Wyse

Program: President Jake introduced our own Joe Wyse, Superintendent/President of Shasta College, who informed the Club about the use of bond monies from Measure H. Measure H is a local school bond measure adopted by the voters in November, 2016. It authorized \$139 million in bond monies and to date, \$90 million in bonds have been sold. A substantial amount of these bond monies has been going to local contractors to construct the developments. Shasta College has used these monies for numerous school projects. These projects include: (1) A Veterans Support & Success Center, (2) A Regional Public Safety Training Center, (3) A Student Services Building at the Tehama County Campus, (4) A Campus Safety Offices Remodel & Warehouse, (5) A Solar Array, (6) A Career Technical Education Building with a Lab containing Advanced Manufacturing Lab Equipment, (7) A Computer Information Systems Building, and (8) Purchase and Development of a downtown Redding office building to

expand various education programs. There have also been several infrastructure upgrades, including air conditioning for the gymnasium. Future plans include a \$15 million renovation of the Library, with 70% of the funds for that project coming from State issued bonds. These are exciting times for Shasta College! Thank you for the update **Joe**.

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
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
