related many of the factors that needed to be considered in trying to open the schools in the midst of the COVID pandemic. Some of the factors that needed to be addressed were:

Wellness: The safety of both staff and students. Determining the amount of PPE needed and developing a reliable supply chain.

Facilities: Physical layout of classrooms, disinfection of office, classrooms, and outside areas.

Technology: Determining what technology was needed for face to face instruction or distance learning or a hybrid mix of the two modalities. This

was made more difficult as the restrictions from the state were eased or tightened.

Instruction: Some of the factors considered were what were the effects of having schools closed since Spring of this year. How much learning "slippage" has taken place. How many children will be returning to school and how many will be staying away? Contingency plans had to be developed to account for what was the situation at the beginning of the school year could change dramatically with no advance warning.




