**Stream Team Update: Once** again RCR's Allied Stream Team Doc Squad produced a substantive change to the non-native vegetation, slash and ladder fuel in the 5R Project area. This morning's effort began with completion of blackberry spraying along Rother Levee from the water intake to the #3 Tee. There are small portions to touch up, but most of the area has been visited once. 2 oz. of personal Remedy were used. In the middle of the effort appeared several struggling California wild rose stems which were carefully avoided.

"Eye Man" Wood covered a large pile of previously gathered material and made two new burn piles by rearranging material cut a month ago. When it rains, these collections near the River will be among the first to disappear.

Meantime, "**Big Metal**" **Maurer** was cutting two new access routes through dead blackberry thickets as well as taking off ladder fuel from native trees. **Bob** has become quite adroit at using his machines to reduce this tangled overburden to a forest floor blanket waiting pitch fork delivery to nearby flames. Additionally, Arundo Stand #5 was almost bisected, a large blow down was dismembered as well as previously cut material reduced to pile size lengths. Lastly, a stubborn DBH 8" non-native locust was used to crush part of a large meadow of tall, dead blackberry canes.

Fifth century B. C. E. Chinese military strategist **Sun Tzu** would have been proud of our conquest using the strength of our enemies to defeat them: making water resistant tepee piles from harvested branches, hacking trails through brittle, sharp needled, morasses using a long pole chainsaw or a hedge trimmer similarly deployed and crushing foes by weight of fallen enemies.

It was great effort in an area precluded from use of heavy equipment like that presently rearranging Henderson Open Space to benefit salmon. RPD CSO Lynn Herreid gave the good news today as he took a Riverview abandoned automobile tire from me at a rendezvous after our ten-man hour session. This is such wonderful information following so many years of waiting. **Mike Mangas** promises a full report tomorrow. You can see what is happening from the Cypress Avenue Bridge. BOR could give Rotary a fine program about this work where so much Club time and treasure have been lavished since 2005.

organized display of over 1 milion lights displayed over 10 acres. Tickets can be purchased online. Here is a glimpse of some of the displays.


