The EDC was founded in 1957. The purpose at that time was to develop The Mountain Lakes Industrial Park. The organization formed the Superior California Economic Development Department (SCEDD).

During the early history some of the businesses that were recruited include, Southern Aluminum Finishing, Knauf, CaptiveAire, Wondermetals and Fresenius Medical.

EDC's main functions are to attract businesses to Redding, business retention and expansion, establish and maintain airline service and scalable startup support.

The Shasta EDC covers a large area serving Shasta County including the City of Redding, City of Anderson and the City of Shasta Lake. Some of the EDC accomplishements have appeared in Business Facilities Magazine as the 2020 7th Best Business Climate—Redding MSA. Also in 2019 The Walton Family Foundaton mentioned Redding EDC as the 29th Most Dyanmic MSA.

To help develop and attract businesses to Redding EDC has partnered with the California Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development.



Some active proposals include Cross Laminated Timber/Modular Developer with 300 jobs, Food Manufacturer with 400 jobs and Lithium-Ion R&D and Manufacturing with 400 job.

EDC is targeting manufacturing that fits our talent pool and supply chain to include, wood products, building products and construction innovation.

EDC also targets professional engineering services. One of the hardest to attract are the remote workers and freelancers. An example would be attracting people from Silicon Valley. The first thing asked is what would the salary be. The answer is one half of what you are making now. The dialogue is continued with the cost of living is not as high. Land cost are much lower than in the big cities. Surprisingly last on the list is recreation and a good safe place to live.

A success story is Fineos + Limelight Health. This business was founded by local insurance broker, Garrett Viggers. It was funded through First Shasta Angel's Investement. This past August this business was sold for \$75M. Other business associated with the **Redding Venture Conference** included Rente, Authenitic-Sales/WAG, Turbans for Tots and several more.

Upcoming events include **Venture Camp.** The kickoff is October 9th at 12:00 p.m. on Facebook Live. There will be four weeks of virtual presentations. One founder will win a \$2500.00 cash prize compliments fo LimeLight Health.

Finally a word about airline service. At present we have service from Redding to San Francisco. It is hoped that in the near future, service from Redding to Los Angeles will return. Some targeted destinations include Denver and Seattle. The airlines being romanced are Alaska and American. During questions and answers it was asked why hasn't the EDC considered Redding To Sacramento. Todd said this is a question very often asked with the answer being the airlines don't like short distance hops. They are just not economical.


Membership Activities


There have been no new members added during the last quarter and we have not lost any members during the last quarter.
