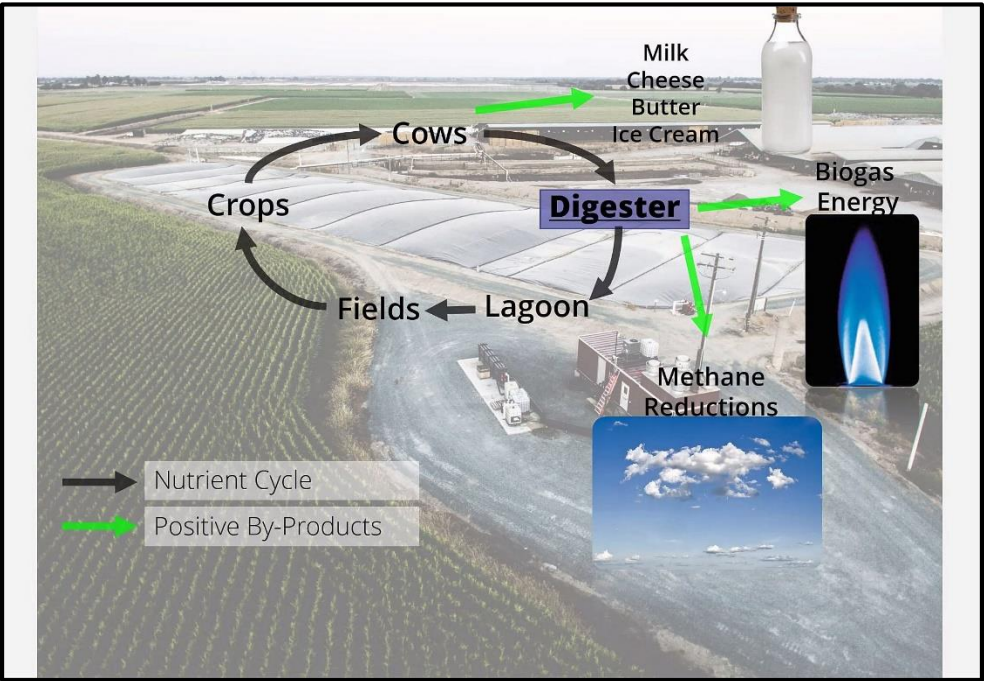
Program: When you have driven by a dairy and smelled that pungent odor, you probably didn't realize that you were actually smelling money in the rough. **Todd Jones**, President of the EDC, introduced **Doug Bryant** of Maas Energy Works. **Doug** is the Communications Director in charge of sales, marketing, and producer relations. **Doug** told us how Maas Energy Works has developed systems to monetize the smell and what is causing it.

manure and market their systems and the methane profitably. The below graphic shows how complete their approach is. They work with dairies and can build a system from scratch or retrofit an existing system.

The graphic on the right shows that the methane and odor that were previously wasted are now harvested, cleaned and converted to liquid Biogas and can be used to fuel vehicles.



Biogas End Use Renewable Compressed Natural Gas (R-CNG)

1. Collect Biogas from nearby digesters
2. Clean up and compress biogas into Biomethane
3. Inject Biomethane into pipeline
4. (at fueling station) Compress biomethane into CNG and fuel vehicles



Energy

Per year, the biogas from one milking cow is the equivalent of roughly:

- 13,000,000 BTU's
- 13,000 cubic ft of natural gas
- 115 gallons of gasoline
- 3,805 kWh of electricity

I did some calculations to see how far one cow could go. In my 3,000 square foot house, the methane produced would heat or cool my house for about 2 ½ months. It could also provide enough gasoline for four months of driving. This is a pretty impressive amount of energy that can now be recovered and monetized. Multiply this by the thousands of dairy cattle in California and it is impressive. Thank you **Doug** for telling us about Maas Energy Works.
