Currently there are nineteen agencies from around the North state who make use of the facility.

There are several advantages to having the Shield Training Center. Agencies no longer need to send their people out of the area for training. This results in a great deal of savings and better use of available personnel. When a big emergency takes place, usually several agencies are involved. Since they often now train together, relationships between the several agencies can develop resulting in more efficiency and safety.

Several agencies were represented today and spoke highly of Shield's effectiveness and efficiency. It is growing program and will be more valuable to the North state as time goes on. Good Program.
