and financial development. In 2016 she founded **Pennies On Purpose**, a youth financial literacy and entrepreneurial nonprofit to more formally and much more broadly equip our youth with the resources they need to be successful in life.

Pennies On Purpose is designed to provide financial literacy and education in young children. There are nine one hour lessons that are taught by financial experts who go into the classrooms and are designed for 4th grade, 8th grades, and 11th grades.

Trisha is also the Director of the **Women's Business Center at JEDI** with offices at 1670 Market Street, Suite 112 in Redding and 205 Chestnut Street in Mount Shasta. Its mission is to increase the economic wellbeing of people and communities through business development and local wealth creation. Since 1997 JEDI has served over 9,500 clients who after coming to JEDI started more than 1,000 business, accessed at least \$19.3 million in business capital, and created over 2,600 jobs. The WBC at JEDI offers training, coaching, financial services, loan services, and moral support to underserved entrepreneurs and especially women in Siskiyou, Shasta, Trinity, and Humboldt counties. Its services are not restricted to women and anyone can access them. Nice program, **Trisha**, you are a busy lady.
