PROGRAM: A TALE OF TWO FAMILIES



Jason Salter introduced **Nikki Blum** of the Redding Refugee Sponsor Circle. He began with a short tale about his own journey into refugee sponsorship. After multiple international crisis in Syria, Afghanistan and Ukraine, **Jason** felt he was not doing all he could, mentioning the oft vacant guest cottage on their property which he had always wanted to fill with a refugee family; albeit without ever having made an effort to do so. Through pure luck, Jason's instigator-of-all-good-things-in-my-life, Irene, received a phone call about a Ukranian refugee family in need of educational assistance to which she replied, "Do they need a house?"

Over the next two weeks, while moving this family into the guest cottage, Jason was subsequently introduced to **Nikki Blum. Nikki** is the president of Redding Refugee Sponsorship Circle. **Nikki** studied journalism and worked as an ad copywriter before starting her own small communications company and then retiring in the North State.

Like all of us, **Nikki** was horrified by the ghastly images coming out of Ukraine after the Russian invasion. Realizing her own fortunate circumstances had her in a unique position to help, **Nikki** began by calling all of the Ukranian Orthodox Churches in Northern California and Oregon. Through them she found a group of like-minded individuals here in Redding, hired a non-profit attorney whose Ukranian wife was boarding a plane the following morning to go cook for refugees on the Polish border. Talk about serendipitous events.

The attorney was able to expedite their 501c3 application, and after several moths of triumphs and setbacks the Redding Refugee Sponsor Circle was born.

Meanwhile, a couple in Redding, **Steve and Gina Dahl**, had already brought a Ukranian refugee family to America, and one of that family, **Anna**, had a childhood friend, named **Ilona**, still stuck in Kyiv. **Ilona** was married with two daughters, **Rinata** and **Erika** (sic) and at this point had already received a temporary travel authorization to come to America with a financial sponsorship offered by **Steve and Gina Dahl**. **Ilona**, however had not yet made the agonizing decision to leave her husband behind, take her two daughters in tow, and make the frightening trip to an unknown land, putting her

Upon learning of **Ilona's** plight, **Nikki** immediately reached out to **Anna**, arranged a video call with **Ilona**, and with these meager assurances, **Ilona** packed only a few belongings, her two daughters, kissed her husband good-bye, and arrived at San Francisco International airport on December 26th.

The journey since then has been eventful to say the least. Vaccinations, driver's licenses, schooling, working, finding a place to live, language, counseling, even orthodontics, were all challenges to be faced. It is hard to comprehend how daunting is the prospect of

moving to another country, especially when that move is hurried, and compelled by events beyond your control.

Ilona and her two daughters are now settled into an apartment. **Ilona** is hoping to find work soon. Her English is improving. Welcome to America, **Ilona**.

For her part, **Nikki** is now ready to find another Ukranian refugee family to hopefully rescue from wartorn Ukraine. For our part, we are supportive and hopeful as well.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Randy Smith wanted to know why our immigration system is so dysfunctional. **Nikki** said if she had an answer for that she would run for office.

Mary Brace asked about their medical care. **Nikki** answered that when the three ladies got Social Security cards, they were able to also get Medi-Cal.

Martin Flack inquired about Nikki's most rewarding moment. While Nikki initially said there were no specific moments more rewarding than others, she did eventually mention two: first seeing llona, Rinata and Erika at the airport, and second, curiously, was when President Zelensky addressed Congress a few weeks back and thanked America for our generous support. She felt as if he was thanking her directly.

Ed Rullman was curious about their work authorization status. **Nikki** replied that exceptions have been made for Ukranians, the work authorization fee has been waived, and they are eligible to work almost immediately after arriving.

CONCLUSION

President Mark then presented **Nikki** with a bag of Poppy Seeds as a thank you, just don't let **IIona** eat them before an employment drug screen! Your author then buzzed out of the Operation game while trying to extract the Adam's Apple, and the winner of the wine and goblet basket held ticket number 101. A good time was had by all.









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
