Michelle Nystrom introduced our speaker, **Bennet Gooch**, President of the Redding Rodeo Association. **Bennett** has been involved in the association for many years. He assumed his role as president 4 years ago.

In honor of the 75th anniversary of the rodeo, some new and special events have been added the festivities. Each rodeo takes about one year to plan. Over the last few years, some of the politics related to the Rodeo Grounds has complicated the planning process.

The good news is that they have already broken records for ticket sales, sponsorships, and community support in general! **Bennet** spent a lot of his time talking not only about the rodeo, but how it is interwoven into the marketing for our whole community.

He talked about the history that many families have with our rodeo. Generations of families have enjoyed the rodeo over decades. He also shared more information about how the Redding and Red Bluff Rodeos stack up with respect to the rodeo circuit around the country.

Our rodeo draws many of the national champions and has for many years. **Bennett** talked about the many events that surround the rodeo including the Asphalt Cowboys breakfast downtown, which typically serves 10,000 people and the parade. Of course, we also have the bank robbery and other events.

This year the Mutton Busting event will be expanded to include 135 kids! Fifteen (15 of the 135) kids will make it into the actual rodeo!





