They received and reviewed 42 applications for these scholarships. The goal is to recognize and reward the efforts of students who excel in academics, sports, and in community service.

Ken Seamans opened the proceedings by introducing his family (wife, **Susan**; daughter, **Sharon**; son, **Brian**). He talked about the mission of the Foundation and his hopefulness about the future with students such as the finalists to be honored today.

After careful consideration, they selected six (6) male and six (6) female student athletes as the "finalists." **Jenny Espino**, from the Record Searchlight, announced the female finalists. Rotarian, **Mark Rincon**, announced the male finalists. From each of these groups of six (6), a winner was selected.



The finalists each received a plaque to commemorate their selection as finalists as well as a check from the Seaman's Foundation for \$500.
