# **Normal Club Activities**

Due to our offsite location at the Nur Pon Open Space, normal club functions such as Recognitions, Craft Talks, and others were not conducted this week. Something to look forwards to next week!

#### Today's Program – NUR PON Open Space (formerly Henderson Open Space)

**Michelle Nystrom** introduced our speaker, **Kim Niemer**, Director, Community Services. Her areas of responsibility include Parks & Recreation. In her introduction, **Michelle** shared that **Kim Niemer** has worked at the City for twenty-five (25) years, in various roles, and has an educational background well aligned with her current responsibilities.

**Kim** shared a little history about her involvement with Rotary in her youth. She was part of a Rotary Study Exchange. As part of such, she spent five (5) weeks in Mexico City.

Some history was shared regarding the effort put in by so many, over more than fifteen (15) years, to try and maintain the beautiful and environmental integrity of this area. She specifically acknowledged the long-term commitment of **Randy Smith** and the "Stream Team." She also shared how the name change to Nur Pon came to be. As part of this space's "new beginnings" and since these waters were important fisheries to our Native American population, they joined efforts with the Redding Rancheria. They decided on the name Nur Pon as it means, "Salmon Run."

The clean-up effort and the construction of new bridges and trails was funded by a number of interested organizations including the City of Redding (clean-up and ongoing maintenance), Dignity Health (fencing), Bureau of Reclamation (Bridges), Water Agencies (Fish Run), and State of California (Trails). There are now restrooms and parking available in the Open Space. The City is allowing "off-leash" dog walking as a means of attracting more foot traffic in the space.

The water ways are open to licensed fishermen that can wade or use non-motorized boats to fish. In addition to the new "fish run," there is a bridge to the island which borders on the main part of the river. There are also two other (2) bridges for added access and a culvert to ensure that fish can travel through the "fish run" and fresh water can enter and exit.

For those that just would like to walk in a beautiful, peaceful place, there is a 3/4 mile natural trail. This Open Space is open daily from Dawn to Dusk. There are four (4) sworn Officers that open and close the park daily. They also patrol during the day to help maintain the environmental integrity and safety in the area. They're also being formally trained as "park rangers" due to the special nature of that open space. In the future, "Story Walks" will be added to describe various parts of the space and its history. Also, more concrete tables and benches will be added for comfort.
