### Today's Program: How To Retain Your Best People

**Michelle Nystrom** introduced our speaker for today, **Matt Plummer**, founder of Zarvana, a corporate coaching company. **Matt** brought us an informative and inspiring presentation on how to be a better manager of people.



He began his presentation discussing the "Great Resignation" that many workers are experiencing since the onset of COVID. Also referred to as the "Great Discontent", this is influencing how managers are having to adapt to retain their best employees.

The "why" behind this discontent can usually be attributed to three things:

- 1. Not seeing opportunities for development
- 2. Not feeling connected to the company's purpose
- 3. Not having strong relationships at work

The challenge for managers is to address these issues and create a culture that inspires and promotes the opposites of these feelings.

One of the first steps is to embody the persona of a "coach" rather than a traditional task-focused "manager". A primary differentiator is the focus on developing people, and before we can help develop people, we have to understand them. From the standpoint of understanding those on your team, **Matt** suggests discovering their "macro motivation", or their "why" for being at your company or organization. He suggests asking the following:

- Why do you do what you do here at our organization?
- Why do you find it meaningful?
- Why is it important for you to do more?
- Why do you want to maximize your contribution?

Another important concept that **Matt** communicated was that of psychological safety, that is, team members feel safe to take risks and be vulnerable in front of each other. Managers who create an environment that is psychologically safe are 1. Vulnerable themselves, 2. Are influenceable themselves, 3. Are comfortable admitting they are wrong, 4. Are encouragers of risk-taking.

In summary, he said great managers do three things well: Coach, Motivate, and Connect.
