#### **CRAFT TALK**



In pursuit of the coveted Blue Badge, **Tenessa Audette** shared her craft talk with us today. **Tenessa** is an interesting character as she detailed in her 90mph seven-minute talk.

**Tenessa** comes from a gigantic Italian family that is rich with veterans and athletes. Indeed, her father still competes at softball at the age of 74.

**Tenessa** is an overcomer. She was raised poor. She did not get her first

#### PAST PRESDENT'S PRESENTATIONS

**PP Ed Rullman** started with a brief introduction of the role of Past President's, which is primarily to nominate the slate of Rotarians to run for office. Then **PP Ed** introduced each of 4 Past Presidents who took the stage to speak about their term in office.

#### **JOE AYER**

**PP Joe (Arggggh!) Ayer** served from 2021-2022. **PP Joe** earned the marauding moniker when the late **Diantha Reynolds**, while introducing her team to start a meeting, repeatedly stumbled over the surname, and the soubriquet stuck.

**PP Joe's** presidency was dominated by the Covid pandemic. This bit of difficulty led to an ill-advised and now infamous survey emailed to the club. **PP Joe's** first bit of advice to future president's is to NOT start your term with a club wide survey.

Another consequential product of the **PP Joe Ayer** presidency was the conception of the Haunted House. Thanks to the brainstorming of **Randy Tate** and his fundraising committee team, the Haunted House has been an idea that scored.

A few more highlights from **PP Joe's** year were the Coffin Induction, the **PP Pat Corey** face-sign sprawl; the awkward Challenge Coin; and who could forget **Eva Jimenez'** Price-is-Right impersonation after winning the President's Card Game.

As if being president was not a big-enough bite at the apple, **PP Joe** is now serving as Assistant District Governor.





**PP Greg Balkovek** has been a Rotarian for over 50 years and served as president from 2010 – 2011. He began by sharing a letter he wrote for the Spillway as a "thank-you" to the club at the close of his highly successful term. Even more impressive was that **PP Greg** served concurrently as the Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce.

During **PP Greg's** 50-year membership Redding Rotary has developed a reputation in the district as an innovator with a strong financial foundation and a history of accomplishment. During **PP Greg's** term they initiated the Hands Program, wherein funds were used to assemble and install prosthetic hands to

disabled individuals in India. Wild game dinner fundraisers were a big hit, as was the BBQ Shoot and Shoes event coordinated along with Anderson Rotary. This event featured playing horseshoes and shooting skeet along with a huge BBQ. Great fun.

The club received numerous accolades for **PP Greg's** term: special recognition and a visit from the Foundation for Polio Plus efforts; District Training held at Shasta College; **Randy Smith** awarded for Stream Team efforts; Club of the Year for District 5160, and the Presidential Citation with Distinction.

#### **PP ART SMITHSON**



**PP Art Smithson** became a Rotarian in October of 1982. One of his favorite memories was his ping-pong ball game. **PP Art** is a huge supporter of our scholarship program, and he wanted his fundraiser to add additional funds for scholarships, which it did to the tune of \$13,000, which increased the scholarship fund by more than 50%.

**PP Art** also reminisced about the Sundial Bridge Gala Dinner. This was a district wide event initiated by our club and three others. It was a dinner and cocktails event on the Sundial Bridge in late June, and Tuxedo's with shorts were not uncommon. It was an enormous success and generated tremendous revenue for the district.

Near the end of **PP Art's** term, feeling something needed to be done to increase community awareness of Rotary, what we do and contribute, he took out a full-page ad in the Record Searchlight to educate the public. Great job **PP Art,** and thanks for serving.

#### **PP JEFF AVERY**



The 2019 – 2020 term was a term of "firsts" for **PP Jeff Avery**. His term saw the first remote meetings and was the first with no public demotion. **PP Jeff** was the first president to start his term without a Rotary bell which was not recovered for three months. He was also the first and only Rotary Vice President as a stop gap to fill a need for another check signatory.

**PP Jeff** shared that you might have thought the pandemic outbreak and remote meetings were the lowlight of his term, but it turns out his biggest disappointment was the reception of his **PP Ed Rullman** remove the shirt game. That game was

shut down early and we all lost the opportunity to spy a shirtless past president, but, thanks to Zoom meetings, Tiger Michiels fulfilled the need.

#### **LOU GERARD**



Although **PP Lou Gerard** was not a featured speaker on Thursday, the Spillway would like to recognize **PP Lou's** significant contributions to the club. Your author will turn 60 next year and **PP Lou Gerard** has been a Rotarian for all but 5 days of my life. He served as President from 1978 – 1979 and was District Governor after that.
