### NORTH STATE SYMPHONY

Jack Kimple introduced Thursday's Speaker Scott Seaton, Musical Director and Conductor of the North State Symphony. Scott has held this post for 9 years, the longest tenured employment of Scott's relatively young life. He is simultaneously the artistic director for the orchestra in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He has conducted numerous other orchestras in South American and Europe and has won several competitions and prizes. Scott is known for his dynamic performances, musical programming innovation and outreach to the community and youth orchestra. Scott is also an avid cyclist and long-distance runner and has completed multiple marathons.

**Scott** spoke to three questions: what is a conductor? what is the North State Symphony? and what kind of things are we doing?

As **Scott** put it, a conductor stands in front of an orchestra and through some black magic is able to conjure sounds from 65 plus musicians all without saying a word. It is a combination of physicality and psychology, requiring the conductor to read the room and infer what the orchestra needs from him which, sometimes, is nothing at all. The result is a creation that lives only in that moment, and never leaves you. This music is timeless, as it would have to be to have survived 200 years.




The North State Symphony is known as a Professional Regional Orchestra, meaning every musician is paid. Indeed, the North State Symphony is the only professional orchestra north of Sacramento, leaving them with an unusually large territory to serve. They perform mostly in Redding and Chico with an occasional performance in Red Bluff and other outreaches to various communities. The symphony makes use of an annual budget of \$500K - \$600K per year. By comparison, the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra has a budget of over \$180 million. Founded in 2001 by combining the Chico and Redding Orchestras, they perform 6-8 concerts a year.

Concert week begins with two rehearsals on the Saturday before the main performances. They then take four days off and reconvene for two more rehearsals on Friday. Then they have a performance on Saturday in either Redding or Chico, then travel one hour to either Redding or Chico for a performance on Sunday. **Scott** strives to have a diversity of musical sets. Along with traditional classical music by Mozart and Beethoven, they perform pop music from the likes of the Beach Boys and Taylor Swift. In May will be a Sounds of the Cinema performance, highlight music made popular in cinema and television. In addition, they perform youth concerts and have young artist competitions.

Redding is fortunate to have a symphony of this caliber that is performed locally. Please support your local North State Symphony.
