#### **PROGRAM**



Assistant District Governor **PP Joe Ayer** introduced District 5160 Governor **PPx2** and **AGx3 Dan Geraldi. Gov Dan** is a practicing attorney specializing in Family Law and Estate Planning, but foremost considers himself a Rotarian. For him Rotary is a family affair, as his father, brother, sister and partner are all Rotarians as well. **Gov Dan's** passion for Rotary has taken him to 16 international conventions and to Uganda where he volunteered on the Uganda Water Service Project.

**Gov Dan** shared what's in store for 2024-2025 from **Rotary International President Stephanie Urchick.** Her theme for this year is The Magic of Rotary. She chose the theme when, after installing a water purification system in earthquake decimated Dominican Republic, two young boys

approached her, tugged her sleeve and said, "Lady, please show us that magic again!"

**Gov Dan** next took a few minutes to talk about Polio Plus. He used the word "audacious" to describe Rotaries commitment to eradicate this disease, and he believes when the work is finally done, and Polio is completely eradicated, Rotary International will be in line for a Nobel Peace Prize. Yah. Audacious.

**Gov Dan** went on to talk about membership. Rotary membership in Northern California has been decreasing over the years, although it is doing fine in other parts of the world. **RIP Stephanie Urchick** has challenged every district to add four new clubs and a net increase of 100 Rotarians over the 24-25 year. District 5160 is in good position to add 4 new clubs, says **Gov Dan**, and he has challenged every Rotarian to invite at least one guest over the next year.
