



PROGRAM



Today's program was delivered by Jeremy Pagan, Director of Development Services for the City of Redding, and he spoke at length about the Redding Riverfront Specific Plan (RRSP) which is a land use document that guides development and planning for a specific area of land, in this case the riverfront from Turtle Bay moving East and South to Cypress Blvd.

It is interesting to note that 100 years ago the Sacramento River formed a simple curved thread around the city of Redding. Today, it is a somewhat sprawling complex of tributaries, estuaries and pools formed by the excavation of aggregate for the construction of Shasta Dam.

The plan itself is far too complex to discuss here; however it will be a continuation of the previous RRSP which was created in the mid 90's. The process is long and begins with 3 community feedback engagements to gather input from the various interest groups. We are currently between the first and second community engagements.

This is an exciting time for the future of the riverfront. I think we can all agree this area is a gem of the Northstate and proper and effective planning can pay dividends for generations.




