Kimberly Johnson Introduced by Jason Salter

Kimberly provided an overview of the staff, facilities, services, and revenue sources for both *One Safe Place (OSF)* and *Children's Legacy Center (CLC)*. She is now the CEO of both organizations. They have been working to combine these two wonderful organizations to gain leverage in the service offerings as well as attain a more sustainable financial model. Currently, CLC is subsidizing OSP to so that it can maintain financial viability – this is to ensure that it can continue to provide the needed services as it has for decades in our community.

She mentioned that this presentation may be the last time she speaks publicly about the two separate organizations. She hinted that the combined organization will likely support a new brand reflective of the combined mission of the new, integrated organization.

Kimberly founded CLC in 2018. It has served our community's abused children and families very well. It has allowed abused children to limit the number of times they have to speak about any experience they have endured. Multiple agencies such as the local police departments, the sheriff's office, DA investigators and prosecutors, HHSA, etc. can all collaborate at CLC and meet so that interview can occur once by a trained interviewer, in a calming location.

Many of you already knew about the wonderful and important work that OSP does in situations where there is domestic violence. It assists these victims and their children to separate from the violence and begin the process of rebuilding.


Joe Girimonte had the white ticket for the TILE Game. He drew an "H." That was good for \$160!


