

Today's Program: SCALE: Success, Capital Access, Leadership for Entrepreneurs

Trisha Funk introduced our speaker for today, **Jamie Winter**, the Small Business Local Engagement Specialist for the California Office of the Small Business Advocate (Cal-OSBA).

Winter, who covers the 16 most northern counties in the state, emphasized the importance of supporting the region's 4.1 million small businesses. A Humboldt State University graduate, she highlighted her passion for her role and her deep connection to Northern California.

She elaborated on the mission of Cal-OSBA,



which operates under the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz). The agency aims to democratize access to capital, diversify the international economy, and catalyze inclusive economic growth.

One of the key initiatives **Winter** discussed was the SCALE network, which stands for Success, Capital Access, and Leadership for Entrepreneurs. This network addresses the myriad questions small business owners have, from starting and managing a business to recovering from disasters. Winter noted that the network includes over 150 small business support centers across California, many co-funded with the Small Business Administration (SBA).



Winter also introduced the Accelerate California Inclusive Innovation Hub, a \$16.5 million program supporting science and technology-based startups. Additionally, she mentioned the upcoming Made in California Program, which will create a database of small manufacturers and offer promotional and financial support.

The impact of these initiatives is significant. Over the past five years, California has seen \$143 million in returns on investment, 66 new businesses per \$1 million invested, and 720,000 small businesses assisted. **Winter** emphasized the importance of these programs in fostering economic growth and stability, particularly in rural areas.


Winter concluded by encouraging small business owners to stay connected through newsletters and social media to keep abreast of new programs and success stories. She reiterated the vital role small businesses play in the state's economy and the importance of continued support and funding.
