

# HISTORY MINUTE

In the Summer of 1995, Rotarian Gene Knaebel was one of five people from the Redding area that participated in a Group Study Exchange (GSE) through Rotary International to Israel. The exchange included a group from Israel hosted by our club earlier that year. Gene met up with them again while on his turn to visit Israel.

Gene's group met up with another GSE group from India during their stay in Israel, and traveled and lived with them for the duration of their five-week trip. At the time, Israel only had one Rotary club and Gene's group was able to see most of the country during their visit.

The purpose of the GSE Program was to build international understanding and good will by learning of different cultures and development friendships. Unfortunately, RI stopped the GSE program in 2013. There is still an exchange program today, but it is the Rotary Youth Exchange for students between the ages of 15-19.

This memorial will honor the

members of the Redding Fire Department who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty as well as recognize those who have served and honorably retired from the Redding Fire Department.

This project has been in the works for a little over four years and originated after the devastating Carr Fire when the Redding Fire Department tragically lost one of its own members, Fire Inspector Jeremy Stoke. Inspector Stoke was not the first to have passed away while on duty or as a result of the dangerous work they do. Other firefighters who have died as a result of this line of work include

Captain Ed Andrews, Inspector Dean Hertzberg, Chief Gerry Gray and Captain Kevin Ward. These men will be honored at this memorial as well.

This memorial will allow our community a peaceful location to honor and express gratitude to the men and women who have so selflessly served and protected the residents of Redding.
