



Today's Program - RPD's Strategic Plan 2024-2027

Chief Brian Barner of the Redding Police Department presented the department's first strategic plan in a decade. The program, introduced by **Joshua Johnson**, highlighted the department's goals and benchmarks aimed at enhancing community safety and organizational wellness.

Chief Barner, who has been with the Redding Police Department since 1992, shared his journey from being the youngest cadet to his current role. He emphasized the importance of understanding the challenges faced by officers, drawing from his extensive experience in various leadership positions within the department.



The strategic plan, which was distributed to attendees, focuses on six primary goals: organizational wellness, quality of life, traffic enforcement, technology advancements, staff recruitment and retention, and property crime enforcement. **Chief Barner** stressed the importance of organizational wellness, noting the implementation of annual psychological checkups for officers to address PTSD and other mental health issues.

Quality of life issues, particularly those related to homelessness and transient camps, were identified as a top priority. **Chief Barner** highlighted the department's proactive approach in addressing these concerns, including the Crisis Intervention Response Team's efforts to provide housing and services to those in need.

Traffic enforcement was also a significant focus, with the addition of more officers to the motor unit and the reintroduction of a dedicated DUI officer. The department aims to improve road safety and reduce traffic-related incidents through increased enforcement and community engagement.

Advancements in technology, such as the introduction of dictation software for report writing and the upcoming implementation of auto citations, were discussed as measures to enhance efficiency and customer service.

Chief Barner concluded by addressing the challenges of recruitment and retention, noting the department's efforts to maintain a fully staffed force despite budget constraints. He also highlighted the success of the undercover stings targeting retail theft, which have significantly reduced property crimes in the area.

The program ended with a Q&A session, where **Chief Barner** addressed community concerns and emphasized the department's commitment to transparency and community involvement.
