
Here's a funny quote from the March 1956 Spillway, after the writer had explained that the Editor was out of town and left the "kids" at home to produce the Spillway unsupervised...

YOUTH SERVICES

- Held a very successful 1st annual mentoring program for local High School Students. This
 years' focus was culinary/hospitality next year we focus on construction/manufacturing.
- Distributed over \$30,000 in scholarships (academic, athletic & blue collar).
- Reinstated our Interact club at Shasta High School. U-Prep has a great club working to incorporate them into our club.
- Honor to Youth has honored students from all of our supported schools (with 3 left) and looking forward to another prosperous Teacher of the Year award. Last year, our chair got creative with our budget, so we could recognize more teachers.
- Rotary selected two students from U-Prep and two students from Shasta High School to attend Camp Royal. Due to scheduling conflicts a different camp was used this year called Grizzly Creek Ranch near Portola.
- Veterans committee did an excellent sendoff program for our local high school students and a great Veterans program in November.

Community Projects

- ➤ 5R Project/Allied Stream Team 1 mile stretch of river cleared, planted, maintained by Randy Smith, Mark and Molly Wood, Jack Kimple, and Bob Mauer, with cameo appearances from Jeff Avery, Dee Potter, and Laurie Baker.
 - > The dedicated workers keep coming back even after multiple yellow jacket stings
 - > 600+ burn piles and feeder piles in total in 325+ partial workdays
- ➤ 119 non-native black locust and ailanthus trees cut to protect 15 identified native Ding-a-ling species accomplished in 3669+ hours of collective manpower.
- > \$3000 spent on herbicide, grass and poppy seeds, shavings for the duck boxes, Buckeye nuts, and native Red Bud, plus \$370 of Private Creeky's own finances.
 - > The 16 maintained duck boxes have housed over 5000 chicks in 15 years.
- ➤ 10 tires extracted, 2 bicycles, pieces of and old car, 6+ shopping carts and too many aluminum cans and bottles to count.
- ➤ Other projects were: Corp. burn yard at Riverview, Ålta Mesa Ailanthus Project, Catalyst Mentoring facility fence and gate installation. Installed 11 fence posts into concrete, along with all the rails and pickets with 15 to 20 Rotarian volunteers.


