Redding Gavin. from Christian High School, is All-League Team an Member on the swim team. Sporting a 3.98 gpa, he plans to apply his \$1500 scholarship to Engineering and Saxophone Performance Studies at Lee University.



Nicholas has been accepted to UC Davis, Riverside and Santa Barbara, as well as Colorado State, Boise State and CSU San Marcos. With so many choices he's not yet decided where to apply his \$1500 scholarship and 3.96 GPA. A varsity football and track athlete, he plans to study Engineering.




